(DEALING WITH BETRAYAL)

2 SAMUEL 15:30-37 ADEOYE, EMMANUEL (EVANG)

So, David went up by the Ascent of the Mount of Olives, and wept as he went up; and HE HAD HIS HEAD COVERED AND WENT BAREFOOT. And all the people who were with him COVERED THEIR HEADS AND WENT UP, WEEPING AS THEY WENT UP.

Then someone told David, saying, "AHITHOPHEL is among the conspirators with Absalom." And David said, "O LORD, I PRAY, TURN THE COUNSEL OF AHITHOPHEL INTO FOOLISHNESS!"

IN 2 SAMUEL CHAPTER 15, WE FIND KING DAVID **FLEEING** FROM JERUSALEM AS HIS SON Absalom stages a rebellion against him. The scene is set on the Mount of Olives, a mountain ridge east of Jerusalem, with a panoramic view of the city below. The atmosphere is tense as David, accompanied by his loyal followers and household, makes his way up the mountain, weeping and barefoot, with his head covered in shame.

Among those with David are his trusted advisors and warriors, including Ittai the Gittite, a foreigner who had pledged his allegiance to David. As they ascend the Mount of Olives, the group is met by Zadok the priest, carrying the Ark of the Covenant, and Abiathar, another priest, who had remained faithful to David.

This passage resonates with us today as we navigate our own experiences of betrayal and sorrow. Just as David found solace in the midst of his sorrow, we too can find comfort in the knowledge that we are not alone, for God's plan unfolds even in our darkest moments.

• HOW CAN WE TRUST GOD'S PLAN DURING BETRAYAL?

David learns that his counsellor Ahithophel has sided with his son Absalom in an attempt to overthrow him in the passage from Samuel *15:30-37*, revealing a moment of intense betrayal. prayer and seeks His guidance and protection in this passage.
